This week, our School Primary Advisor visited the school and completed a learning walk with SLT – a snapshot of her feedback:

"In KS2, the role of adults supporting learning and ensuring adaptations to enable children to access the curriculum was impressive. Every child was on task, involved and in some cases engrossed in learning. Children were using i-pads to research and complete tasks related to the Big Question. Behaviour for learning was gorgeous. In KS1, there was a high level of consistency. The provision in the classroom enabled children to practice and use and apply learning. The provision and opportunity for children to practice and use the resources in the shared space e.g the DT project really works and it was great to see how children were using their learning to evaluate their vehicles and review their effectiveness."

During next week the year 6 children will be visiting classes to offer the children an opportunity to make a cash donation to the Poppy Appeal and receive a poppy.




