

Mathematics:

Children will be focusing on developing their fluency skills in the 2's, 5's and 10 times tables along with developing a secure understanding of addition and subtraction.

Science:

As scientists we will be finding out about the human body. We will discover how to keep our bodies and minds healthy. We will identify, name, draw and label basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with which sense. As well as this, we will find out about the basic needs of a human.

Art & DT:

In art, we will be looking at printing taking inspiration from William Morris. We will be showing pattern and texture using dots and lines.

Music:

As musicians, children will be using parts of their body to create different sounds. They will explore musical vocabulary such as high, low, quiet and loud as well as thinking about what parts of the body are involved in humming, whistling and whispering.

Computing:

This term we will be focusing on using the internet safely, children will know where to ask for help if they need it and understand that the internet needs to be used safely and respectfully learning how to keep personal information private. We will be learning how to use ICT to organise, store and manipulate digital content.

History:

In History, children will learn about Mary Seacole and why she is remembered today. We will explore her life and how she influenced the world of medicine. We will compare hospitals from the past to those today and use role play to explore this further.

PSHE:

In PSHE, we will be exploring people who help us. We will learn how to stay fit and healthy and look at keeping clean by brushing our teeth. We will look at the role of nurses, doctors and dentists.

Physical Education:

This term, we will focus on team building skills through team games. We will also explore basic movements and body patterns through dance.

Religious Education:

Children will be looking at the main beliefs and ideas of Judaism and Islam. We will be comparing and identifying how religion is expressed in different ways. We will also be looking at the role of food in different religious festivals.

Writing:

As writers, we will continue to put reading at the forefront of our learning and base our literacy around key texts. We will explore a range of genres and provide opportunities for lots of discussion and role play. KS1 writing skills will be taught across the year. We will focus on researching how to keep ourselves happy and create a non-chronological report on what we have found out.
