Our Expectations in 5/6




- Year 5 and 6 will be a happy and harmonious zone if we all work together, children, staff, parents.

How to join your student on Showbie

- Download the Showbie app from the Tunes App Store, or visit showbie.com to access the app in your web browser.
- 2. Choose Sign Up.
- 3. Choose I'm a Parent.
- Enter your name, email address, and a password. Tap Sign Up.
- Enter your parent code: GR8RKU. Tap Add Student.

Home Learning

This will start on Monday 23rd AFTER THE YEAR 6 RESIDENTIAL

Reading -20 minutes daily. Stamina is key to accessing secondary curriculum = 139 - 194 wpm

Spelling – Lists will be set every week on Monday. A formal test will be on the following Monday

Maths – set on Tuesday and due in by the following Monday TT Rockstars = aim is to get their heat map green! X 3 times per week

Grammar and Punctuation : Set on a Thursday and due in the following Thursday

Homework club – (we are there to support you if your child is finding home learning difficult to access)

Your child will have homework every night at secondary school and so we want to begin to teach them how to do some work independently at home to prepare them.

E-safety will be taught continuously and closely monitored


Mobile phones can be brought to school so they can send you a message that they arrived at school but must be handed in to the mobile phone box for safe storage
