contribution to the funds raised from the BBQs. All fundraising for the school benefits your children directly; I hope you will have seen the Fundraising Newsletter sent a couple of weeks ago sharing how this funding is being spent.

Last week, I shared one of the school's four Strategic Development Foci for the coming year, which was becoming a Well School Well Schools Film - YouTube¹. Please do come to hear more from Miss Perry, our PE Lead on Thursday 28th September, next week from 9-10am in the hall to hear about we are supporting physical health through activity and how you can be involved.

This week, I share another of the four which is Reading. In summer 2022, we invested in a new phonics scheme which is now embedded across school and this year our 2021 Intake (current Year 2) achieved and AMAZING 91% on their Year 1 Phonics Check. The phonic skills are key to early reading alongside access to rich and varied stories, poems, rhymes and non-fiction. Reading with children is a key part of this success to follow up the high-quality teaching in school. As we focus on reading in school, you can help by reading at home with your children. The Reading Shed is being relaunched next week once the new shed arrives, so there will be lots of books available to borrow. Any parents/carers, grandparents, other family members or community members who may be interested in volunteering to read with children in school can contact office@hemingfordgrey.cambs.sch.uk² for an application form.

We have an open-door approach at Hemingford school and value the contribution in positive and constructive feedback that our parents and carers provide. Following the information last week about how to raise a concern or get in touch with us at school, just another gentle reminder that if you have a concern or query related to your child, please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance. A lot of anxieties can be reduced by talking to the class teacher or phase leader. We are keen to collect parent/carer views and usually use the Ofsted questions twice per year. Next week, we will be sending a slightly different questionnaire, more specific to our school to gather views as valued stakeholders of the school.
